

The Cobra F9 Speedback

When Cobra brought out its then-new King F8+ driver in late 2017, staff player Rickie Fowler put it in play immediately and he finished the year averaging 300.3 yards off the tee. Then in 2018, with the F8+ in the bag from the first of the year, he averaged 300.6 yards driving distance.

Not bad for a vertically challenged, slight-of-frame player – Rickie's just 5'9" and 150 pounds, and that's probably with his Puma golf shoes on! – regardless of the fact he's one of the best conditioned athletes on the PGA Tour.

But for the 2019 season just concluded, the extremely popular Fowler switched to the new Cobra King F9 Speedback driver and finished the year with a driving average of 303.1.

OK, it's not a huge difference. But three yards is three yards and when you consider you're taking a finely tuned athlete, already playing with the most technologically advanced equipment available ... and his numbers are improving, not by tenths of yards but by yards? Well, that's saying something.

Now, if you're already playing Cobra's King F8 or F8+, you might not feel three, five or even 10 yards is worth the investment in Cobra's newest driver. But if you haven't tried Cobra in the last few years – or if you're like so many, who have gotten locked in to a driver from one of the "big four" manufacturers – it's high time you tried the F9.

We recently had a chance to demo Cobra's latest driving weapon and, like Fowler, it's gone straight into the staring lineup, replacing an old favorite that had survived several generations of updates from literally all the big name OEMs. For the record, our test club is a 9-degree head, fitted with a 6.0 (stiff) HZRDUS Smoke shaft (one of four premium stock shafts available without any up-charge).

Why the King F9 found its way into the bag when so many other drivers from so many other manufacturers had not is a function of the F9's technology, certainly. But it's also a matter of intangibles associated with the club – subjective factors like looks, feel and sound.

Let's start with those, since most golfers will agree, if a club doesn't look and feel good, technology doesn't mean squat. And to our eye, the King F9 Speedback is one of the more appealing drivers we've seen in years. True, it's a 460-cc head but it has a more compact, more playable look, thanks to an aerodynamic design that features softer, rounded leading edges and raised crown, skirt and tail areas that swallow all 460 cubic centimeters in a taller profile, as opposed to an unwieldy-looking, more expansive footprint. The adjustable hosel, which allows for plus or minus 1- and 1.5-degree loft adjustments in standard lie and +/- 1-degree draw positions, provides eight different loft/face angle options.

As for feel and sound, the two go hand-in-hand with the King F9. And both can be described in one word: Solid.

Considering the driver features a CNC milled face, with thicknesses and curvatures controlled to the tightest industry standards, and a carbon fiber crown that wraps the entire head – a crown that is Cobra's largest ever and is 10 grams lighter than titanium –

both sound and feel are certainly products of the F9's advanced technology. But human hands and ears can't feel and hear technology. What the player feels and hears is simply the satisfying "thwack" of solid contact, even on strikes that are slightly off-center. No hollow, metallic clanks, nor overly dampened thuds.

In addition to the adjustable hosel, the F9 Speedback features two moveable sole weights, one 14 grams and one 2 grams, that allow players to fine tune the center of gravity, thus fine tuning launch angle, trajectory and spin rate. With the heavier weight forward, just behind the face, players who prefer to "work" the ball will benefit from a low to mid launch angle and lower spin rates, as well as a slight fade bias. Switch the weights, moving the heavier one to the pronounced "Speedback" bulge, set low at the back of the head, and drives launch in the mid-to-high range with slightly more spin and a more forgiving, drawbiased trajectory.

The adjustability of the King F9 Speedback make the club extremely playable for a wide range of skill levels, from mid- to high-handicappers to Fowler, himself. There's even a "Tour Length" model that, at 44.5", is still an inch longer than what Rickie plays, but is an inch shorter than the standard King F9. The Tour Length, aimed specifically at elite players, comes with 18- and 6-gram sole weights "to help deliver more accuracy without sacrificing distance," according to Cobra.

Without any up-charge, F9 buyers can select from four premium shafts from three different manufacturers. The HZRDUS Smoke 60 shaft, from Project X, in our test driver is a midweight shaft with a mid-launch, low-spin profile for players with medium to faster swing speeds. Fujikura's Atmos Tour Spec Blue 6 shaft is aimed at the same player, but produces a mid-launch, mid-spin profile, while the Atmos Tour Spec Black 7 is a heavier shaft for faster-swing players looking for low-launch, low-spin characteristics. And finally, UST Mamiya's Helium shaft is a lightweight option that provides a higher launch for players with slower swings.

If you want Rickie's Graphite Design Tour AD IZ-7x shaft, that will cost extra at your local club fitter. But the four premium shaft options offered by Cobra at the \$449 retail price are the genuine after-market articles, not proprietary versions made specifically for the OEM.

We haven't talked here about all the technical advances Cobra has built into the King F9 Speedback because, frankly, we can't "see" things like the E9 Technology that expands the sweet spot across nine different points on the face. Or the 7-degree face axis tilt that makes up for the "toe droop" that occurs at the bottom of every swing. Or the perfected bulge of the CNC milled face or the roll curvature that enhances the aerodynamics of both the crown and sole. And we don't expect golfers to "see" those things when they're shopping for a new driver.

But if you are in the market for a new driver and you don't consider the Cobra King F9 Speedback, you're cheating yourself. And that is a tangible fact.

It is an intriguing question – how does one improve on greatness? Ponder that for a moment.

Heck if you have already received recognition and respect you obviously want to maintain that level of greatness and so work a little harder to find areas where you might improve.

For a golf course, it's a never-ending battle with Mother Nature to maintain a level of greatness. But improve?

Bulle Rock Golf Club, the Pete Dye masterpiece located just off Interstate 95 in northeast Maryland, has been recognized with the respect of players and golf enthusiasts since being unveiled in 1998.

You want chops? The LPGA played five major championships between 2005 and 2009 and saw an impressive list of Hall of Fame caliber champions such as Annika Sorenstam and Se Ri Pak hoist the trophy. Other winners included Anna Nordqvist, Yani Tseng and Suzann Pettersen. Numerous state and regional competitions have been held there, to say nothing about USGA qualifying for national championships.

A 148 slope on its course rating tells a story about its difficulty, and numerous plaudits have been given by players of all abilities on the venue itself as another chapter of its own. Bulle Rock is a special place.

For 20 plus years Golfweek magazine has recognized Bulle Rock as one of the best modern courses in United States. It also has the layout as number one course "you can play" in the State of Maryland.

After her win Pak said, "What a win! And over such an outstanding golf course. It was a major challenge for the players, as a major championship should be. I'm thrilled to have won. This golf course is an intense challenge."

No doubt Bulle Rock has the credentials to beckon daily fee players

throughout the East Coast, whether for a day trip or a stop on the way to destinations such as Ocean City, Md., Williamsburg, Va., Pinehurst, NC or Myrtle Beach, SC. It's an easy stop along the way.

But improve as a golf course? You bet!

One guy who knows is Operations Director Damon Klepczynski, PGA, who was brought on board a while back to do just that as the club was placed on the market. You see, through all the plaudits and the greatness Bulle Rock was not a --- well --- profitable facility.

Its fees were high, as in above \$125, and many players extolled its virtues but couldn't find a way to play more than one or two rounds a year. It's a difficult layout, and up to six hours was needed to truly play the course as its course rating indicates.

In many respects, Bulle Rock epitomized Lee Trevino's views of the state of the game. "Golf is too expensive, it takes to long to play, and it is just plain hard!" the Merry Mex told me few years back.

That about described Bulle Rock to the casual observer. Klepczynski addressed that statement and more when he arrived at the facility.

"Basically, I spoke with our customers. What did they love about Bulle Rock, what they didn't like? How could we improve the overall golf experience? We knew we had a demanding course, a classical layout, but we knew we needed to improve the bottom line," said the native of Bucks County, Pa. "Nothing was sacred, we considered everything."

First off, the golf course is legendary, one of Dye's best works and that is saying something. But for most players it was over the top penal. A slightly offline shot found its way, many times, in tall fescue grass that was hard to hit from if findable at all. "We addressed this my taking down the historical

fescue on 13 holes, providing for challenge and difficulty with less lost balls," explained Klepczynski. "That enhancement alone cut about 45 minutes out without severely impacting the general difficulty."

The players loved the revision, it made a world of difference. An errant shot was penalized by the rough, but it didn't lead to a lost ball.

Another revision was to add a fifth set of tees giving visitors an option to play the right distance for their game. Additionally, there is a separate set of youth tees to enhance the experience for all levels of player.

Small enhancements to the bunkering were completed, sodding a couple of what started as more than 140 bunkers on the site. This eliminated a couple, say, dreaded 60-yard bunker shots and enhanced playability and cut a couple minutes from what was a marathon.

The club owner, MTBR LLC, has had the club on the sale market for a bit, and while there has been lots of interest at this writing there is no deal complete. Under Klepczynski's oversight the financials have improved as rounds are up as is the club's food and beverage revenue stream.

Daily fees were refreshingly lowered, and more players came. Course enhancements reduced the amount of time to play, and the restaurant business was buoyed by a new golfer friendly menu and addition of numerous TV screens to allow viewing of golf and other sports while enjoying a beverage or meal.

Also introduced were up to 100 golf memberships to attract more play from the local community, something that was absent in prior years.

"We created a little bit of buzz," laughed Klepczynski. "All of these things have been well received, and all we have to look at is the increase in business as an indicator of success."

Heck, some even believe the facility will be in the green for the year!

Dye carved Bulle Rock over acres of rolling terrain in Harve de Grace near the junction of the Susquehanna River and the Chesapeake Bay. Its signature hole is, well, all of them. Each hole stands on its own as a unique test, with obstacles to snare errant shots and pristine greens that tantalize.

The tests are endless. The par-5 second, a 489-yard rolls downhill with

trees to the left and OB to the right, is a classic Northeast hole. The green is well protected, slightly uphill from the fairway, making club selection imperative. The hole stretches out to 572-yards for the long knockers. Of course, diabolical Dye worked his magic around a stream less than 100 yards from the green that acts as a magnet. Beware!

Dye offers a respite in the par-3 third hole (116 to 177 yards) so a player must take advantage and score before the next two demanding par-4s. That's the beauty of a Pete Dye design, as all the holes have difficulty and uniqueness, but some are just plain angry bears.

Trademark railroad ties are woven into the design, but not overbearing. Bunkers are strategically placed and seem to jump out to bite at the most inopportune times. Dye's creations seem to lull into a sense of security at times, but clearly force the player to take their medicine when required.

The par-3 12th hole (138-190 yards) requires evading of a lake all along the right side. The green protrudes into the lake so shots short, right or even a bit long can easily find a watery grave. Bunkers guard the left to force players to pick their poison.

The closing hole, the par-4, 377-yard (485 from the back tees) 18th, is a test that brings fear to the heart and swing of every golfer. Water blankets the left side of the hole, a hill on the right, while the pin position on the green allows for multiple opportunities that can cause a couple club difference for the player. Many a match is settled right there below the clubhouse.

"It is an exciting hole," explained Klepczynski. "So many variables, so many nuances, it promotes strategic play."

Today Bulle Rock continues as a challenging must play course, one that is not only difficult but playable and surely memorable. And the public agrees with its wallet, as rounds played increase by more than 1,000. The small membership base provides some financial stability and the buzz from visitors gets around and leads to more play.

Clearly, the club is well on the way toward providing a better experience and better value, something that is providing a nice shot in the arm improving an already great test of golf and overall free-standing golf experience.

All was accomplished without upending the designer's approach. As the legendary Pete Dye said, "I did not undo God's work."

What About A Fall Getaway To Ocean City, Maryland Courses

It had been a slow day at the office, that day when summer was soon ending and my mind was on a much needed fall golf trip.

I love golf in the fall, when the courses aren't crowded, conditions are superb and the weather pretty darn good.

Unfortunately, I didn't have a lot of time off, and the office was badgering me about a big project due by the end of the year. I could surely tack on a couple days to a weekend and head with the guys on a golf vacation, but time was of the essence.

As a Pennsylvania guy, I have to admit trips to Myrtle Beach or Pinehurst were attractive. Shoulder season meant lower rates and deals could be found. But time, well, that was another story. Couldn't get more time off, and the drive alone would take the better part of two days. Ugh.

Brainstorm.

What about a getaway to Ocean City, Maryland, where golf courses are plentiful, there's nightlife and great accommodations? Where some of the game's top golf course architects have samples of their work? Where value is abundant?

Problem solved. An OC long weekend means great golf at the beach and, if desired, golf on the way down and on getaway day.

The Ocean City drive is relatively easy, and the courses are challenging. It's a win-win situation. Off season golf means less crowded fairways and excellent conditions. Plus, if you haven't visited in a bit would be undoubtedly be surprised at the quality of golf courses in the area.

"We are blessed with good weather, wonderful amenities and of course some very challenging and fun golf courses," explained Steve Cooper, Director of Golf at the Pete/P.B. Dye designed **Rum Pointe Seaside Links** course. "Fall

golf is outstanding, as the course conditions are wonderful and from a golfer's perspective the rates are cheaper. Your dollar goes farther while the drive from Pennsylvania is shorter!"

Rum Pointe is part of the Ruark Golf Group, which also oversees outstanding sister courses the Links at Lighthouse Sound, **Nutter's Crossing** and two courses at **Glen Riddle, Man O'War and War Admiral.**

Also in the vicinity are the Ocean City Golf Club, Eagles Landing, River Run, the Bay Club and Ocean Pines among others. Just beyond the Delaware State line are outstanding tests such as the beautiful Baywood Greens, the Jack Nicklaus designed Bayside, The Rookery (North and South courses), The Salt Pond and Bear Trap Dune.

Suffice it to say, there is superb golf available within the friendly confines of the greater Ocean City destination. There's also ample accommodations, stellar dining, fishing and a boardwalk to boot.

"The area has so much to offer and we're an east drive from just about anywhere in the Northeast," added Cooper. "We have a great array of course options designed by superb architects and some unbelievable scenery. It's a great destination."

Rum Pointe offers great views of Assateague Island across the bay, with many offering views that one just has to say can be breathtaking. Of course, those water views mean difficulty for players who don't pay enough attention to placement of their shots.

"But I have to say our course can be tough, but it's fair," added Cooper. "We have players who visit year after year."

Bayside is a Jack Nicklaus signature design ranked number one on statewide places to play by several golf magazines, and rightfully so. It winds

through magnificent pine trees and features simply stunning holes along the Assawoman Bay coastline. Golf shots can be made difficult by Mother Nature's best hazards, like salt marshes, ponds and of course the seemingly ever-present winds.

Nearby **Baywood Greens** is, in a word, unique. The awesome, beautiful flowers alone will awe you! The course is challenging but fair, and has been described by some as an "Augusta of the North". Its course has been named among Delaware's best by Golfweek and Golf Digest, and offers excellent practice facilities including chipping and putting tests.

The Woodside nine is carved out of beautiful hardwood trees. The Waterside nine features ponds on nearly every hole. Add in strong bunkering, mounds and hazards and one has to play a thinking, strategic game to score

well.

The Gary Player designed **River Run Golf Club** prides itself as being in pristine condition throughout the year, and Fall is a great time to sample. Player's designs are always pleasing to the golfer, and River Run is no exception.

The Links at Lighthouse Sound, an Arthur Hills design, is among the top-ranked courses to play in Maryland not only because of its architecturally sound course but spectacular views. Just across the bay from Ocean City, there are 10 holes bordering marshlands. Play runs through stately hardwoods, and the courses gives one a links feel.

The fourth hole (stretching to 430-yards) offers obstacles such as marshland all the way down the right side while strategically placed bunkers guard the left. A true challenge, as is the par-3 fifth which can play anywhere from 100-220-yards and features guarding three sides of the green. Throw in

prevailing winds and trouble is everywhere.

It's interesting to note that the longest cart bridge in the US – some 1,500 feet – can be found heading to the back nine. Challenges await! And to send you home smiling is the reachable par-5 18th hole, a true risk-reward test. Play it right and hit a couple good shots and birdies are there for the taking. Mishit a shot and, well, a dreaded big number awaits.

Eagle's Landing overlooks Sinepuxet Bay and offers views of Assateague Island National Seashore, but unless you have binoculars you won't see the wild horses who frolic in the area. What you will see is a series of well thought out challenges that will bedazzle you. The Signature hole is the par-4 18th, with its salt marshes and tight landing areas. A true test.

Ocean Pines features a design by Robert Trent Jones, one that has matured since its opening in 1972. The course is nestled between natural wetlands and scenic woodlands and has five sets of tees as well as tees for the PGA of America's Family Course program. A par of 72 awaits.

The Ocean City Golf Club offers 36 championship holes on its Newport and Seaside layouts. Located a short drive from the Boardwalk, these courses are filled with challenge.

There is a cornucopia of options when thinking of golf in the greater Ocean City, Md. vicinity, and when you combine this with all the accoutrements of the area as well as its proximity to Pennsylvania it must be considered for a fall golf destination. The courses are outstanding, and Fall is a great time of year to sample.

The weather is superb, the courses memorable and the value of the dollar works for most wallets. It's a can't miss destination. Fall golf at its finest.



There are a lot of golf products that promise to make you play better. Training aids are the leader in that category.

There are a lot of instructors who also promise to help you play better. They often do.

"The problem is, if you're a weekend warrior and you're not used to hitting a lot of balls and you get to the range and drop down 75 balls, hit them one-after-another off a hard mat, then you wonder why your wrists and elbows are sore," explained Dr. Zelouf, who also admitted to a similar type of excessive practice. "There is no doubt, that can cause quite a bit of damage."

Dr. Zelouf's test took place, using the StrikeAbsorber mat at his home – hitting many golf balls into a net.

"This product enables much better absorption of vibration, which is really the killer, especially if you have golfer's elbow like myself," said Dr. Zelouf. "I've had it off and on for the better part of five years, so I am very careful. If you're going to hit balls, it's better to have a mat that has better absorption characteristics like the StrikeAbsorber mat.

"If you have a hitting area at your house or in your basement, it's definitely something you want to consider," concluded Dr. Zelouf. "I think it's a good product."







37th AGA/GAP Senior Coal Scuttle Championship



Scranton Municipal Golf Course captured its first AGA/GAP Senior Coal Scuttle Championship title at Huntsville Golf Club

Huntsville, Pa. – Scranton Municipal Golf Course captured its first AGA/GAP Senior Coal Scuttle Championship title Aug. 27 at Huntsville Golf Club (par 72, 6,273 yards).

It filed a 16-over-par 304 to edge Fox Hill Country Club. The top four of five scores count toward the team total.

"It's great. We're kind of a working-class club, so it means a lot to our guys," Robert Andrejko, a longtime Scranton Municipal member, said. "We have a lot of good players. It's a really big win for our club."

Andrejko carded an even-par 72 to lead the Scranton Municipal team.

"I made every par putt I looked at. I putted very well," Andrejko, 60, of Jessup, Pa., said. "I thought the course was very difficult; it played long and there were some tough pins. But I made a lot of par saves, which was really big."

A handful of those saves came from a distance of 10 feet on Huntsville's back nine. Andrejko inked a inward 2 under to help boost Scranton Municipal atop the leaderboard. A pine tree foiled his attempt to reach the par 5, 464-yard 14th hole in two. A solid sand wedge to three feet for birdie, however, nullified the bark interference. On No. 16 (par 4, 366 yards), Andrejko hit a smooth 9-iron 135 to two feet above the flagstick for another birdie. The four-time AGA/GAP Senior Player of the Year, fresh off first-place performances in the Spring Stroke Play Championship and Stroke Play Championship, respectively, continues to excel in 2019.

"I've been hitting it well. If I get the driver going, then I usually have a decent round," Andrejko said.

Scranton Municipal won the Men's Coal Scuttle Championship in 2003. Carryovers from that team include Andrejko and Mark Bartkowski, who carded a 4-over-par 76 at Huntsville. Robin Bonda and Vince Scarpetta rounded out the Scranton Municipal scoring contingent with respective 78s.

Elkview Country Club's Michael Heck carded a 4-under-par 68 to claim the Senior Coal Scuttle's individual title.

"It was one of those days," Heck, 63, of Jermyn, Pa., said. "First of all, I hit my driver in the middle of every fairway. And I got a couple of tips for putting. It made a big difference."

Heck enacted a few pointers from Bill Studsman, an assistant professional at Elkview. He also took to heart words of wisdom from his daughter Laura.


"I wasn't putting very well, and she told me, 'Remember one thing. Never look back at the bad shot you hit. Just move on to produce a good one," Michael said.

Plenty of good ones at Huntsville. A pair of back-to-back birdies stand out on Heck's scorecard: a chip-in on No. 5 (par 3, 153 yards) and a 9-iron 116 yards to four feet on No. 6 (par 4, 338 yards).

The Senior Coal Scuttle Championship, now in its 37th year, is an offshoot of the AGA's most distinguished event: the Men's Coal Scuttle Championship, which will take place Sept. 28-29 at Glemana National Golf Club and Wyoming Valley Country Club.

The fox says five straight titles for Fox Hill

Exeter, Pa.– The Skulk Supremacy: a suggested title for the AGA/GAP Super-Senior Coal Scuttle Championship documentary, should fairway filmmakers ever pursue.

Fox Hill Country Club captured its fifth-straight title at home Aug. 21. It filed a 9-over-par 222 to edge Emanon Country Club by a stroke. Len Coleman, representing Emanon, earned the event's individual title with a 4-under-par 67.

The top three of four scores count toward the team total. The AGA/GAP Super-Senior Coat Scuttle Championship, now in its fifth year, is contested on the defending champion's turf. Fox Hill is trending toward permanent site status.

"On a good day from the white tees here, we can shoot under par. That gives us an edge over a lot of courses," Ed Hennigan, who led the Fox Hill contingent with a 2-over-par 73, said. "It's nice to have it at Fox Hill. We know the course so well. But it's getting a little harder; we're getting older and the younger [Super-Senior golfers] are coming up. It was a close finish this time."

Hennigan, as well as teammates Bill Lawler and Jim Hoover, all birdied No. 18 (par 4, 330 yards) to inch Fox Hill ahead of Emanon the leaderboard. Lawler's 3 afforded a 4-over-par 75. Hennigan's 10-footer hung on the lip for two seconds before deciding to drop into the jar.

Hoover, too, experienced a nail-biting finish. Playing in the day's last group, he "fell asleep" on No. 17 (par 4, 334 yards) while standing at 1 over.

"I was only 100 yards from the green," Hoover, 65, of Dallas, Pa., said. "I chunked my second shot, bladed my third shot, bladed my fourth shot and finally got one on the green to make a 7. It was one of those holes where you just want to get out and get done."

Fox Hill crossed the finish line in first place thanks to Hoover's 15-footer for birdie on No. 18, which followed an 8-iron shot from 144 yards to a front hole location. Leave it to the club's reigning Super-Senior champion to ensure another Super-Senior victory.

"Our team was a strong team," Hoover, a Fox Hill member of seven years, said. "This was my first year playing [in the Super-Senior Coal Scuttle]. Now I see why those guys win every year; they're such competitors. We'll be ready to go again next year. The group we have is very competitive."

Thomas Gill, last year's Super-Senior celebrity for Fox Hill, rounded out the team with an 8-over-par 79. Overall, seven teams competed in the event.



Established in 1968, the PGA Professional Championship roster of Cham-



Michael Brown Stymies Scranton for Art Wall Jr. Crown

Blichar takes Senior Division at Art Wall Allshouse takes Art Wall Super-Senior

SCRANTON, Pa. – Lu Lu Country Club's Michael Brown, Jr. played outstanding golf over 36 holes, finishing as the only player under par and winning the 15th Art Wall, Jr. Memorial Championship at the historic Country Club of Scranton. Brown fired rounds of 71-72 to finish at 1-under par 143 and claim the trophy in the event, which was presented by LECOM. Brown had a two-shot lead after Monday's opening round and played smart, sound golf on Tuesday to seal the win.

"I guess my game plan today was to play conservatively on the par 4s and par 3s and try to attack the par 5s, unless I had a short club in my hand," said Brown. "The greens are so extreme here and the wind was up enough today to where I did end up playing conservative on those holes."

The plan worked out well, as Brown exploited the par 5s during the 36 holes, finishing those at 4-under par in the event.

"I knew that I had to make my hay on the par 5s here because I seemed to giving shots back on the other holes."

Brown had a three-shot lead as he made the turn in the second round, and he promptly birdied both No. 11 and No. 12 to practically put the championship out of reach.

"After I birdied No. 12, I started to feel pretty comfortable and just tried to hit the middle of the green and two-putt," Brown said.

Helping Brown out along the way were some clutch up and downs, including on the par-4 15th hole. There, he hit his tee shot into the left bunker and pitched out, leaving himself 54 yards to the flag for his third shot. He took advantage of a shot he's familiar with and pitched it close, leaving a short putt for par that he converted to remain on top.

"It's a shot that I practice a lot but I hit that absolutely perfect and at the right time," Brown stated. "I was happy to see that one get close because that green is so tough to putt."

Another par save on No. 16 was equally impressive, as Brown was at the front of the green with a back hole location.

"My iron shot into the green stopped a lot quicker than I expected and I ended up with a double breaker from about a mile away but I got the speed right, luckily," said Brown, whose lag nearly went in and left him another short putt that he converted for par.

On the par-3 17th, Brown blistered a 4-iron that went further than he expected and landed in the rough, but he showed his resolve by chipping on to the green and then draining a 25-footer for the par.

That left just the par-5 18th, where Brown hit a perfect drive to set up the clinching

par putt.

"I was trying to figure out earlier in the day how to get to that flag and the only way I could figure was to hit a high fade and that drive was the only way to give myself a chance to do that," Brown said.

Finishing in second place at 148 (+4) was Pinecrest Country Club's Mike Marron. Hannastown Golf Club's Kevin Fajt and Honesdale Golf Club's Eric Williams tied for third at 6-over par 150. PAGA Individual Member David Blichar, who won the Senior Division, tied for fifth with 2017 event winner Dan Brown of Pine Meadows Golf Complex at 7-over par.


